Grand Isle to Houma to Thibodaux, there is something so special about our community and the people who live here. The support that the Bayou Community Foundation has received from neighbors like you over the past two years is just one example of the tremendous love and concern we all have for this unique and wonderful place we call home.

It was this passion for our coastal communities that drove the creation of the Bayou Community Foundation in 2012. After watching other metropolitan areas like New Orleans and Baton Rouge receive millions in aid from national and international donors following Hurricane Katrina and then the 2010 Gulf oil spill, a few local residents got together to make sure that Lafourche, Terrebonne and Grand Isle specifically did not get passed over again when a natural disaster or crisis impacts our area. It was time to put the Bayou Region on the philanthropic map, so to speak!

What we lacked during these past disasters was a "bucket" to accept these worldwide donations. This "bucket" most often comes in the form of a community foundation, which most large private, family and corpo-

rate foundations around the world require before making a large contribution. So, in 2012, with the critical assistance of the Greater New Orleans Foundation, the Bayou Community Foundation was created with contributions by local residents and a \$500,000-over-five-years challenge grant from the Gheens Foundation.

Chairman's Message

Since that time, your support has helped to "fill our bucket," and has allowed BCF to award over \$350,000 in grants to local non-profits for programs such as mental health treatment for young people, prescriptions for the poor, books for pre-school children, and heaters for the elderly, among others.

With your continued help, the BCF bucket will continue to grow and be ready to offer immediate help and attract significant donations from outside of our area the next time tragedy strikes our Bayou Region. Thank you for putting your heart in the Bayou!

Your Contributions Target Our Community's Greatest Needs

At Bayou Community Foundation, we want our donors to know that your investment is being used to target the highest needs of our community. That's why we conducted a first-ever "Bayou Region Community Needs Assessment" in January 2013 to hear from civic leaders in Lafourche, Terrebonne, and Grand Isle about what they considered to be the most pressing, unmet needs in our area.

Across the board, **mental health and substance abuse treatment** was identified as our region's most critical need—impacting students and our school system, health care, the legal system, and our workforce. Also noted were needs for quality early childhood programs, workforce development programs at the junior high and high school levels, services for at-risk youth, rural access to health care, food and transportation programs for the elderly, and coastal restoration projects and education programs. BCF continues to use this assessment to guide our competitive grant-making programs, putting your donations to work overcoming our community's greatest challenges! Helping Our NonProfits Grow

Our local nonprofits provide valuable services to residents and our community at large. **Your donations help us help them succeed!** On October 23, BCF partnered with the Greater New Orleans Foundation to host a free "Fundraising with Individuals" workshop for 35 local nonprofit leaders. More workshops like this are planned for 2015.



Through your contributions, BCF grants in 2013 and 2014 support a SCLHSA mobile outreach program, providing mental health services to 1,086 patients in Lafourche and Terrebonne who are unable to travel to a doctor's office for appointments.
